The education tour is one of the most popular activities at the Northwoods Wildlife Center. It's perfect for getting the family out of

the house, something to do with friends, or rounding out a day's activities. On our education tour, you will see various raptors native to Northern Wisconsin, including

a bald eagle, a great-horned owl, a goshawk, a redtailed hawk and a broad-winged hawk. You will also get to see a full-



sized bald eagle nest, test your grip against some of the strongest grips in the animal kingdom and learn all sorts of great things about birds of prey.
